TAI SOPHIA INSTITUTE TO OFFER FREE WORKSHOPS FOR HEALTH-CARE PROFESSIONALS

Funded by Columbia Foundation Grant, Workshops Support Front-Line Care Givers and HR Professionals

LAUREL, MD (February 11, 2010) – Tai Sophia Institute, a preeminent academic institution for wellness-based education based in Howard County, Maryland, has received a grant from the Columbia Foundation to offer free workshops in March on handling job-related stress for Howard County frontline care givers and human resource staff of agencies such as nursing homes, hospice care, mental health programs, crisis intervention and domestic violence centers, those working with developmentally disabled citizens and other similar agencies, as well as nurses, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, and physicians.

"Keeping the Health-Care Professional Healthy' offers new and effective methods for Howard County health-care professionals and health-care human resource staff to care for themselves, as well as their patients and clients, in ways that will help avoid job-related burnout, absenteeism, and turnover," said Cheryl Walker, M.L., MCC, program manager, Health and Wellness Coaching, Tai Sophia Institute, and a workshop instructor. The workshop, offered twice in March and free to nonprofits, will teach innovative care-giving and self-care skills including proactive methods of managing stress triggers, effective ways for building relationships with patients and clients, and nutritional and herbal support for care givers.

"We are pleased to have received a grant from the Columbia Foundation to offer this much-needed program to health-care workers at no cost," said Robert Duggan, M.Ac.(UK), president and co-founder of Tai Sophia Institute. "Self-care skills – knowing how to create wellness for oneself while giving to others – are crucial to the well-being, sustainability, and effectiveness of our community's many, dedicated care givers and other front-line workers." Duggan also will teach during the workshops.
