**“ABOVE THE CHANGING LANDSCAPE”
Opens September 2 at Tai Sophia Institute’s Himmelfarb Gallery
Features Aerial Photographs by Maryland Artist/Pilot Peter Stern**

August 23, 2010 (Laurel, MD) – **“Above the Changing Landscape,”** aerial photographs by Baltimore, Maryland, artist Peter Stern, opens Thursday, September 2, in the Himmelfarb Gallery at Tai Sophia Institute. An **Artist Reception** will be held on **Thursday, September 16 from 5:00-7:00 p.m.**

Peter Stern combines his passion for art, nature, and flying in aerial photography. In this exhibition we see images taken during flights to Pennsylvania’s coal region where he photographs the bleak yet beautiful landscape. “In my work, I seek out the in-between places – the odd, the unusual, the overlooked, the forgotten – presenting them in a way that draws the viewer into a third space, somewhere between the abstract and the representational,” said Stern.

Stern has had a number of solo exhibitions in Baltimore, as well as having aerial photographs exhibited at the Schwenkfelder Library and Heritage Center (Pennsylvania) and the Smithsonian Institute’s Air and Space Museum (Washington, DC). Articles about his aerial photography have appeared in *Ultraflight* and *Powered Sport Aviation* magazines.

Peter Stern’s love of flying began at age 15 when he took flying lessons near his hometown of Crawfordsville, IN. This love was reignited when he discovered ultralights at an airpark on Maryland’s Eastern Shore in 2003. Stern’s love of artmaking began when he was in his 20s when he started taking nature photographs in New England and studying photography at Johnson State College in Vermont. In time, he integrated his loves through aerial photography.
