“Healing, Straight from the Heart to the Golden Hour” Paintings by David Terrar

Opens January 3 at Himmelfarb Gallery, Maryland University of Integrative Health

LAUREL, MD – “Healing, Straight from the Heart to the Golden Hour” features seven paintings by Maryland artist David Terrar and opens Tuesday, January 3, 2017 in the Himmelfarb Gallery at Maryland University of Integrative Health (MUIH). A reception for the artist will be held on Thursday, January 26 from 5:00 – 7:00 pm.

A few years ago Terrar had a heart attack. While in the hospital the medical team referred to his “Golden Hour,” a reference to the last hour of a person’s life. During his weeks of recovery the term ‘Golden Hour’ frequently rang through his thoughts. One beautiful autumn day, he observed the last hour of sun setting on the western horizon through the trees and the color shift in the sky to a golden hue. Everything changed color to various golden shades. The near-death experience led to this series of paintings which capturing that special glow in oil paints and by using real gold (23K).

An experienced painter, Terrar ties his experience of the heart attack and the golden hour of the day into paintings that are both representational and abstract. He aims to connect with people and take them to a different place through symbols he incorporates into these paintings. For those who are suffering he wishes to alleviate their stress and their pain, even if only for a few seconds. He illustrates trees as a sign of strength, power, and stability; the leaves represent the curative effect of herbal and medicinal properties; the golden sun coming through the trees brings warmth and light. Gold has been a symbol of hope for people in darkness for the last thousand years. The color scheme is drawn from the colors of autumn and winter, symbolic of nature's annual period of rest and hibernation.
